### *Principal's Message*

**M**y, how time flies when you are having fun! It is hard to believe that we are rapidly approaching the conclusion of another school year.

It has been an exciting year with many new challenges and wonderful experiences. All of these things bring growth for us as the Timpview family because we experience them together. We have experienced our third straight championships in football and cross country, and a state championship in swimming. We have experienced the life changing impact of Rachel's Challenge. We have had the opportunity to reach out to others through our Sub for Santa and Invisible Children fund raising activities. Members of our girl's soccer team are preparing to travel to Uganda to provide service for schools and children there. We are currently awaiting the final word on the outcome of our eight National Merit Scholars. Our math competition teams have done very well, our band, choir, orchestra, and drama teams have excelled in their spring region festivals. Our HOSA, FBLA and VICA clubs have garnered high honors in their respective areas. Timpview has been recognized nationally and locally for our academic excellence. To summarize, I think we can say that we are doing very well.

We do have our challenges however. The financial crisis that is affecting the nation is also being felt at Timpview. We have had to reduce the hours of some support staff and anticipate that we may have to do more. We are committed to trying to avoid reducing the number of classroom teachers although we have been given the additional assignment of caring

for all ninth grade students. Previously those who were found below proficiency had been assigned to Independence High School for one year for remedial work in order to prepare them for regular high school work.

We are also concerned about the twenty percent of our students who traditionally have not met proficiency, and we are working on that challenge currently. The fall of 2009 may show some minor changes in our bell schedule as a result of those efforts, but the changes will be minimal.

We recognize that all of the success we have had at Timpview is a result of a united effort on the part of all stakeholders. Although I am a firm believer that the most important element in educational success is the quality of the classroom teacher, I also realize that our success is due to positive support and encouragement from the home. We have great teachers. We have wonderful students. We have supportive and involved parents. That is the formula for success.

Thank you for another memorable year. Have an enjoyable summer with your families and we hope to see all of you safe and well in August.

**SUMMER FIELD STUDIES 2009**  
**Provo School District**

This program is designed to increase the student's conceptual understanding, awareness and appreciation of the interrelatedness of all living things; provide opportunities for students to design and carry out research of ecosystems in the field and to present their findings; and to motivate students to become active participants concerning the conservation and wise use of our natural resources.

During this two-week program, students will work in teams to evaluate the riparian habitat along the Provo River, wetlands surrounding Utah Lake, the San Rafael Desert and the forests of the Uintah Mountains. Students will visit the sites, design a plan of study, use research techniques and technology to obtain data, organize their data into tables, charts and graphs, evaluate the information and write up their conclusions for presentation in either a report format, poster format or power point format.

The program will be run as two separate two-week sessions each containing 20-24 students in order to accommodate the number of interested students. For the June session, students will spend one of the two weeks at the UVU education center near Capital Reef National Monument. For the July session, overnight field trips are planned for the San Rafael Area Emery Co. (1 night) and the Uintah Mountains (2 nights).

- When:** There are two sessions.  
 Session #1 June 15-26, 2009; all day Monday - Friday each week.  
 Session #2 July 20-31, 2009; all day Monday - Friday each week.
- Who:** Students who have earned at least a "B" in high school biology or who have approval of the teachers may enroll.
- Credit:** Students who successfully complete the course will receive 1 semester (.5) of upper level science credit for Ecology Field Studies.
- How To Enroll:** Enroll now by paying your registration fee at the Timpview High bookstore or Provo High School office. Enrollment will be limited to 24 students on a first come basis. If the class is full you may place your name on a waiting list. Please sign the class list for the correct session when registering for the class. Include the name of the student, phone and address.
- Cost:** \$150.00 per student. Fee includes the cost of materials and transportation. Each student will provide their own food on field trips and overnights.
